#### **KCOM Broadband**

The installation of KCOM full fibre broadband in Leconfield is due to commence in **late March** and is expected to take up to 3 months. A total of just over 700 properties are expected to be fitted with full fibre broadband in this timeframe, which includes 86 new connections. Arram will not feature in this rollout but KCOM engineers are working on ways of getting the necessary cabling to Arram itself. New contracts with KCOM and upgrades to your present KCOM contract will be available for purchase in July.

During the installation process there will be some disruption to pavements and roads and letters detailing which streets will be affected will be sent out 2 weeks before work starts. KCOM have committed to keep LecPC informed of progress and disruptions and this information will be posted on the village website. #### Ken Brooke (BEM) – A Tribute

Ken BROOKE, B.E.M. (81yrs) passed away on the 15th January 2022 in Claremont House, Beverley. Many people in Leconfield will have fond memories of a kind, generous man and this piece is a tribute to the service he gave.

In 1969 Ken was posted to Leconfield as the police rural beat officer, there were few people who wouldn't know who he was, and in return he knew most people! He continued to live in Leconfield when his work took him elsewhere.

He became a member of the Parish Council holding the positions of Vice Chair and Chair. During this time his ability to raise funds for various ventures was second to none. He raised thousands to assist in the refurbishment of the village hall, building of an outdoor all weather sports court, cricket nets and store rooms. He was an active member of the local Playing Fields Association and again raised thousands towards new equipment.

He was heavily involved in the response to the flooding in 2007 seeking and obtaining immediate help from the Leconfield Barracks, assisting in the supply of sandbags and helping stranded motorists.

His commitment to the local area found him working and raising money for the local church restoration, youth club, bowls club, and recreation centre. He also assisted raising funds for a local rugby player who needed to raise cash to attend a rugby tour to Australia with Hull Kingston Rovers. HKR was just one of Ken's passions. His other passions included horse racing and Ken took it upon himself to begin raising funds for the Injured Jockey's Association. He raised money not only for the jockeys but also to build a new convalescent home in Malton.

His charity work raised hundreds of thousands for the Leconfield area and culminated in him being nominated for and awarded the British Empire Medal for his services to the Parish of Leconfield, Beverley Westwood Hospital and the Injured Jockey's Association.

#### CAFÉ PROJECT

The former library has now been transformed into a light and airy meeting space. It is the first of many projects to give the Village hall a 'facelift'. We are now hoping to start regular café sessions in the Spring and are keen to know if you would be willing to volunteer. However we have now learnt that the kitchen area also needs to be improved prior to registration for regular café sessions.

Leconfield Parish Council has agreed to support a project to replace the existing kitchen with a new catering kitchen, which will be compliant with modern Food Safety regulations and also be suitable for both volunteers and professionals to use. We are currently scoping the project and have already purchased some of the catering units. **Wren kitchens** have kindly offered to supply new storage cupboards free of charge. We need to remove the old units, undertake some renovation of the walls, redecorate and replace the floor, install more sockets and an extractor system and purchase appliances. If you can help us with any of the above either through the supply of services or a donation then we would love to hear from you.

We are hoping to complete this project by the time we hold our Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebration in early June. In the interim we will be holding 'pop-up' café sessions run by volunteers including a Youth cafe, family café and occasional open door sessions for all. We do need more volunteers to run the café but also to wash up and bake at home..!
